




Census Geography Hierarchy

How is the Census Data Used?

- Every year, the federal government distributes more than \$400 billion to state, local and tribal governments based on census data.
- Census data guide local decision-makers on where to build new roads, hospitals, child-care and senior centers, schools and more.
- Census data determine how many seats each state will have in the U.S. House of Representatives.

2006-2010 ACS 5-Year Estimates released December 8, 2011; some new 5-year data products to be released in 2012

The 5-year ACS estimates (based on data collected from 2006 to 2010) were released in December 2011. The Census Bureau will release a 5-year estimate annually, dropping the oldest year and averaging the most recent five years of data. The Census Bureau does not publish estimates for small numbers of people if there is a probability that an individual can be identified. **Note**: Census tracts and block groups will be released in the 5-year estimates only, even if their population meets the threshold of 20,000 required for a 3-year estimate. Zip Code Tabulation Area (ZCTA) estimates will first be available in 2012, with the release of the 2007-2011 estimates.


